Guest Speaker - Guernsey Mind

Mental health accounts for 33% of visits to local GPs and as many as 1 in 4 people experience a mental health problem in Guernsey in any given year. September's Guest Speaker, Emily Litten from Guernsey Mind, spoke about their creative approach to managing mental health. The "Mind Employment Service" have trained over 700 people from 17 businesses on how to cope with Mental health issues in the workplace. Have you registered to vote yet?

If you want things to change in Guernsey for disabled islanders and carers, it's really important that you register to vote. Please fill in the form that came through the post or go to www.election2016.gg to register online. It just takes 5 minutes.

Do you have a legal guardian?

Make sure you fill in the second part of the registration form to ensure your name is added to the register.

*Compulsory for 18 year olds, otherwise optional.

The rules about who is able to vote are changing. If you have a legal guardian or are receiving treatment in hospital for a mental health condition, you will be able to vote in the 2016 General Election but not in 2015. If this applies to you, please complete the section below in order that you can be added to the Electoral Roll as soon as the law changes.

Education

Guernsey's Education Department was recently inspected by Education Scotland who highlighted "inclusion" as an area of weakness.
