- A new building for La Mare de Carteret Primary School

Education Law Policy Letter

Education Law (1970) will be repealed and replaced

Areas that are being considered include, but are not limited to:

- governance
- entitlement to education
- regulation and financial arrangements
- alignment with the Disability & Inclusion Strategy, discrimination legislation and CYPP and international conventions

One School, two Colleges

- Significantly more space than is typical of schools of this type elsewhere for all including SEN
- Both sites will have CAS bases - students can attend the college closest to them and move to secondary school with their peers
- The new school will work closely with the special schools and with external professionals to ensure the best possible support for all students

One School, two Colleges

- Fewer Transitions
- Corridors will be wider than standard corridors, and the draft building plans have factored in flow around the building
- Fully accessible
- ‘Schools within Schools’

Education Law Review

- An Education Law Working Group has been established to oversee the policy development, which will result in a Policy Letter.
- An SEN Education Law Working Group has been established.
- Whilst developing the policy, there will be opportunities for different groups to share their views and engage with the review before launching a formal consultation in quarter four 2019. This will include students, parents, school staff, other professionals, the third sector and the wider community.
