Learning Disability Week

This year the Adult Disability Services organised multiple events for learning disability (LD) week, the theme for this year was health care focusing on the 'treat me well' campaign by MENCAP. This was the biggest LD week Guernsey has ever hosted.

Some of the events included:

- Display stands in two entrances of the princess Elizabeth hospital, one focused on speech bubbles of why people were supporting learning disability week.
- History of learning disability session which was attended by various staff across HSC.
- Visit to London's Supreme Court in Parliament square for the launch of a new Learning Disability Campaign called healthier futures changing care.
- Service users and staff went to the hospital canteen to meet staff and talk to them about how's best to help them in hospital, there were activities with a personalised jigsaw and mindfulness colouring



Employers' Disability Charter

The Employer's Disability Charter is aimed at helping employers to prepare for the forthcoming discrimination legislation by implementing best practice and promoting inclusivity for disabled people in employment. It contains nine commitments which businesses sign up to and work towards. There are currently 23 organisations signed up to the Charter across a diverse range of sectors including finance; charities; retail; construction; education; utilities and government. The most recent businesses to have signed up include – GSPCA, KPMG, GROW, Waitrose, Channel Seaways and the CIPD Guernsey Branch.

This was the third year that disabled people were able to complete part of the Saffery Rotary walk with the number of participants increasing over the last 3 years.
